The Sabbath in Nazareth was spent at the local synagogue meeting which most likely was held in a humble place. Perhaps a simple house served both as a place of prayer and for taking up matters of common interest, including work to be done together to help people in need. Jesus would have heard readings from the Bible as well as preaching. Any adult male could preach. It is easy to imagine Jesus listening to his father or neighbor preaching in this way. Jesus learned to pray with his family. He once used a blessing thanking children for understanding his message, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants."

When we come together on our Sabbath, how do we understand the message of Jesus? Are we wise but unhearing? How can we be like little children? How can we go out after Mass and help those in need?

Catechetical Sunday

Many U.S diocese and parishes celebrate Catechetical Sunday each year. We honor and bless not only the catechists who work with our children but also parents who are essential to the process of handing down the faith to their children.
