Thomas Berry, C.P. was a priest of the Passionist order who is known for his advocacy for the earth. His "ecotheology" focused on a deep understanding of history and functioning of the universe in order to guide us as a species. He followed in the footsteps of Teilhard de Chardin, priest and geologist.

Berry believed that humanity needed to take on a new role as caretaker of the earth. Peace among nations and cultures was at the heart of his work. He studied the Philippines, India, China, and Native American cultures and lived in most of the countries he wrote about. He espoused working *with* rather than *against* nature and using natural methods of agriculture and habitat protection.
